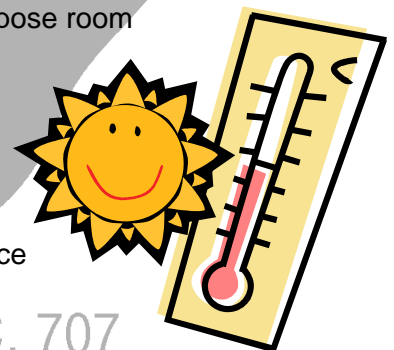

2009 STATE 4-H FIELD DAY

Over 800 4-H members participated in the 2009 State 4-H Field Day on May 30, 2009 at UC Davis. The State 4-H Field Day provides 4-H members from across the state an opportunity to share their 4-H project knowledge, skills and participate in contests. The event engages youth and adults alike in hands-on demonstrations of 4-H work going on around California. The State 4-H Field Day is a combination of educational activities and contests. Over 470 4-H members competed in the State 4-H Presentation Day, over 100 in the State 4-H Fashion Revue, over 100 in the 4-H Plant Science Contest, over 300 in the judging contest, and thirty-eight in the Interview Contest. 4-H members, siblings, parents and others participated in hands-on demonstrations in 4-H science, engineering and technology, citizenship, and community service activities. 4-H members played with goop and eco-pots in the Siskiyou County and State 4-H SET exhibits; the bugs from the UCD Bohart Entomology Museum; found hidden caches using GPS units; tested their knowledge of geology; and used water quality testing tools from Merced County. Over 2,000 stuffed animals were donated by 4-H members for this year's community service project: Teddy Bear Challenge. They are being donated to local children's hospitals.

In the State 4-H Presentation Day Cody Murphy of Arbuckle 4-H received a Blue award for his demonstration "What Came First" in the junior division. In the State 4-H Fashion Revue two Colusa County members participated. Madisyn Lohman of Arbuckle 4-H in the junior division Apron Challenge received a Blue Ribbon, and Caitlyn Murphy also of Arbuckle 4-H received a Red Ribbon for the intermediate division traditional category.

BEGINNING A NEW YEAR

As you start planning your 4-H year there are a few things to keep in mind. One year break in service for leaders requires recertification when returning as a leader the following year(s). To avoid this recertification it is recommended leaders who are taking a year or so off consider enrolling and pay the \$6.00 fee the year of the hiatus.



All youth and leaders are strongly encouraged to enroll in August and September to take full advantage of the 4-H opportunities. December 1st all those not enrolled are dropped from our mailing list and computer records.

Reminder:

As of July 1, 2006 there must be two adults available at all times to supervise youth.

- These adults should, whenever possible, stay within view of one another.
- The best practice is that both of these adults are appointed 4-H volunteers.

It is for the protection of our youth, but also protects adults.

The National 4-H Conference is the Secretary of Agriculture's premier youth development opportunity to engage youth in developing recommendations for the 4-H Youth Development Program.

The National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth and adults--at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture--assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development Programs nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Provinces.

As the sponsor for this conference, the National 4-H Headquarters--located within Families, 4-H, and Nutrition at the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA's) Cooperative Research, Education and Extension Service (CSREES)--is charged with sharing the recommendations that emerge from the conference with the Secretary of Agriculture, national Extension Program Leaders, and others who determine 4-H programs. Volunteering Is Good For Adults and Youth!

We already know that adults who volunteer receive many benefits, but the same holds true for teens! According to a study reported in National Clearinghouse for Youth and Families, "Adolescents who take part in community service or volunteer in political activities are more likely to continue having a strong work ethic as adults. Volunteering is also related to overall positive academic, psychological, and occupational outcomes.

- A study by the Corporation for National & Community Service found that 55 percent of 12-18-year-olds volunteered through a formal organization in 2004, compared to a volunteer rate of 29 percent for adults, though fewer youth than adults volunteered once a month or more.
- While low-income youth are less likely to have participated in school-based volunteer service, disadvantaged youth who volunteer are more likely to volunteer again, to discuss politics with friends and with parents and other adults, to believe that people can be trusted, and to hold a positive view of the future."
